## **2.2 SOUTH AFRICAN RECORD REGULATIONS**

### **2.2.1 GENERAL RULES**

- a. Skiers licensed as competitive skiers with other Federations are not eligible to set any SA or Provincial records, but may set "all-comers" records.
- b. Provincial records can only be set at performances achieved at sanctioned tournaments held within the provincial boundaries of the relevant province.
- c. South African National records should be set at performances achieved at Standing List or Record Capability events (as defined in Section 7). However, in the event that a tournament is not a Standing List event due to the qualifications of the judges only, then the tournament committee may consider a new record application with sufficient evidence of the skier's performance as defined in Section 2.2.3. The TC decision after review will be final.
- d. Any South African record performance exceeding the existing E&A or World record will be downgraded to a score equal to that of the existing E&A or World record, unless it was performed at a Record Capability competition and the records is accepted by the E&A or World Tournament Council.
- e. A performance will count for South African record purposes in the category in which he/she competed. Should that record equal or better a category in which the skier is eligible to ski, and the same rules apply to that category, the skier will then also hold the South African record in those categories.

For clarity, this applies to younger skier skiing up in age to and including the Open age group, or older skiers skiing down in age to and including the Open age group; but where the same shortening speed is used for slalom, or the same maximum ramp height and top speed is used in jump.

- ~~f. Should an Under 12, Under 14 or Under 17 skiers compete in an older age category or open competition, the performance will count for South African record purposes as the category in which he/she competed and not his/her actual age category.~~
- ~~g. Should a Senior skier compete in a younger age category or open competition, the performance will count for South African record purposes as the category in which he/she competed and not his/her actual age category.~~
- ~~h. For competitions where the South African Tournament Water Ski Selection Committee selects the entry, the category in which the skier is entered will be at the discretion of that committee.~~

### **2.2.2 UPKEEP OF RECORDS**

- a. The TC will compile a list of pending record performances throughout the tournament season, which will be posted on the Division website after each event.
- b. The TC will meet regularly, but not later than the SA National Championships, to accept or decline pending performances. After such meetings, the pending performance list must be updated showing whether accepted or declined. If declined, a reason will be given, but the TC decision is final. The list must also be updated on the website.
- c. Annually the South African Tournament Additional Rules must be updated with the new records.
- d. In the event a performance has not been included in the list, the performance must be pointed out to the TC within 1 calendar year from the date of that performance. If the information required to consider the performance is not freely available, the onus is upon the person requesting the record performance to provide the information to the TC within 1 month after the request for the information.

### **2.2.3 VERIFICATION OF SA RECORDS**

For a performance to be recognised as a new SA Record, the following procedure must be followed:

Information required for Standing List event:

- set of results.
- where possible a list of judges.
- if it is deemed necessary by the TC, the actual trick runs in questions must have been recorded on a video which must be reviewed by a panel of the Technical Committees choice for verification.
- any information that might influence the ratification of the performance.

If the competition is not Standing List, for an SA Record to be broken, the following is to be met and details supplied to the Technical Committee:

1. CJ to be an international official	
2. Equipment in Standing List tolerances (including all camera requirements)	Homologation files to be provided and all equipment checked as per IWWF rules (including ropes).
3. List of officials	For the event when the record was set.
4. Approved Speed Control	Times recorded and kept as evidence.
5. For a Slalom Record	End-course videos for all passes leading to the record.
6. For a Tricks Record	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>o Judge tricks sheets</li><li>o Boat video</li></ul>

Although the record verification cannot change the score recorded in the tournament, the score may be changed for record acceptance

### 2.2.4 VIDEO REVIEW

#### Tricks

A skier or his representative will be entitled to request that the Technical Committee review the video of a trick performance, if the total score of the actual tricks performed would have exceeded a current National Record, prior to disallowance's.

However, video review may not be required if the record is set at a titled event.

## **SECTION 3 - SOUTH AFRICAN SUPPLEMENTARY TECHNICAL REGULATIONS**

Wherever feasible the current International Water Ski and Wakeboard Federation Technical Rules and any amendments applicable to the IWWF - Confederation (E&A) will apply at all South African Tournament Division Calendar competitions, except as amended in the following South African Tournament Division Rules.

South African Water Ski and Wakeboard Federation and Tournament Division Rules concerning competitor behaviour, official's behaviour and Doping Rules apply to all persons taking part in Tournament water skiing. Copies of these rules are available and are published on the South African Water Ski Web pages

IWWF, SAWWF and SASCOC are bound by the international Safeguarding Policy and participants and official must make themselves aware of this policy, who the Safeguarding Officer is at each competition and at the Federation.

### **3.1 COMPETITION REGULATIONS**

#### **3.1.1 INTERPRETATION OF THE RULES**

Interpretations of the rules should be referred to the Technical Committee when possible. In the interest of expediency, the Chief Judge, after discussion with his panel, may give his own interpretation which shall be binding until the Technical Committee has been polled. This shall serve however, only as a temporary interpretation until the question has been referred to the entire Committee. Such a poll shall take place as promptly and in the most practical manner as possible.

#### **3.1.2 EVENTS & ROUNDS**

As per E&A Rule 25.01, for Ranking List, competitions of 2 or 3 events must have at least 15 competitors in total. Competitions of 1 event must have at least 8 competitors. If these numbers are not met, the homologation level for that event will be limited to Normal Homologation.

Refer to IWWF Rule 2.02 for the number of rounds

A skier can enter any rounds without having qualified in the preceding rounds.

#### **3.1.3 FAMILIARISATION**

Familiarisation (official practice) shall be offered by the tournament organiser under the authority and responsibility of the Chief Judge based on the principle that each skier shall receive an equal opportunity for familiarisation.

#### **3.1.4 SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT EVENT SCORING**

Each contestant's best score from all the rounds shall be used for determining placement in the event

Slalom: The skier will be credited with the number of buoys effectively passed (from 0 to 6). Six buoys will be added to the results of the competitor for each pass between the actual starting speed and the minimum starting speed as defined for the particular category as long as the first pass is successful

Tricks: The sum of the two passes of each round

Jump: The longest jump of each round.

### 3.1.5 SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT OVERALL SCORING

The better result in any of the rounds will be counted towards calculating overall on the following basis:

<b>Tricks and Slalom</b>	<u>Skiers score</u> E&A Lower Standard	x 1000
<b>Men's Jump</b>	<u>Skiers score</u> E&A Lower Standard	x 1000
<b>Ladies Jump</b>	<u>Skiers score</u> E&A Lower Standard	x 1000

## 3.2 SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT SKI DIVISIONS AGE CATEGORIES

### 3.2.1 DIVISIONS

Competition for the three events shall be separated into the following types of divisions.

#### 3.2.1.1 AGE DIVISIONS

Determined by the contestant's age as at midnight of 31 December prior to the Tournament.

South African Tournament Division recommends that before moving to a 1.65 metre ramp, women are at least 17 years of age and capable of jumping at least 30 metres off a 1.5 metre ramp.

South African Tournament Division recommends that before moving to a 1.80 metre ramp, men are at least 17 years of age and capable of jumping at least 45 metres off a 1.65 metre ramp.

The following restrictions shall apply to Under 12 Girls and Under 12 Boys division:

- the boat path will be between the ramp and the 15 metre buoys of the jump course
- at no time may the skier cross the boat wake during the approach to the ramp

Men 35+ shall use the 1.50m ramp unless they can show a certified result of a jump of 38m on a 1.50m ramp in which case they may opt to jump on a 1.65m ramp.

### **3.5.3 GENERAL SLALOM CONDITIONS**

In the event of a delay of 10 minutes or more between a skier's passes, a free warm-up pass will be offered to the skier. The skier may not fall, but has a protected score.

## **3.6 TRICKS – SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT COMPETITION REGULATIONS**

### **3.6.1 TRICKS LIST**

A list of declared tricks to be attempted by the skier may be required from each entrant in the trick event before the event starts. This decision will be made by the CHIEF JUDGE prior to the start of the competition, and could apply to only certain specified categories or certain specified skiers or both or to all skiers in all categories.

## **3.7 REGION EUROPEAN VARIATION FROM WORLD RULES**

The IWWF – European Confederation Additional Rules make variations from the IWWF Technical Rules (World Rules). Unless otherwise stated in these South African Water Ski Additional Rules the variations apply to all competitions in South Africa

### **3.7.1 FALL IN JUMPING**

The following guidance is given to Judges and Safety Directors. (As the suggested actions are not covered by the IWWF Rules they can only be taken at South African Water Ski competitions).

If a skier falls and states within 3 minutes that he wishes to continue, but the boat judge reports that he thinks the skier may be injured:-

- a If there is no officially appointed Doctor immediately available - the Safety Director/Event Judge should not allow the skier to jump again. See IWWF Rule 10.07.
- b If an officially appointed Doctor is immediately available - the Safety Director / Chief Judge should stop the competition for long enough for the Doctor to examine the skier and report. If the delay causes problems for the completion of the competition the next competitor (s) should ski whilst the skier is being examined.

If the Doctor then reports that the skier is not injured and would have been in a fit condition to ski within 3 minutes he should be allowed to take his other jump.

If the Doctor reports that the skier would not have been in a fit condition to ski within the 3 minutes, he should not be allowed to jump again (even if, by the end of the examination he is in a fit condition to jump again).

### **3.7.2 ALCOHOL**

Officials are reminded that alcohol can impair performance and judgement. They should be mindful of this for the duration of a competition.

### **3.7.3 OFFICIAL PUNCTUALITY**

Officials shall attend any meetings called by the Chief Judge unless specifically excused, and shall be in their positions at least 10 minutes before the start of each event.

Appointed drivers shall arrive on site in adequate time before the scheduled start time of familiarisation.

## **SECTION 4 – TOURNAMENT ORGANISER RESPONSIBILITIES**

### **4.1 SOUTH AFRICAN CHAMPIONSHIPS**

#### **Chief Judge / Appointed Officials**

The Tournament Committee will appoint the Chief Judge, Homologator, Calculator, Judge Panel, Chief Driver and Drivers. The Chief Judge shall be a Level 1 (J1) or Level 2 (J2) Judge (3 events).

The Tournament Committee will invite the selected officials and assist with transport and accommodation if required. The Tournament Committee will ensure that enough officials are available to run the Championships as a Standing List competition (3 events).

The Chief Judge shall supervise all judging and scoring operations and shall select the Judges and the assistants for each event from the available Appointed Judges.

Assignment of the drivers to individual events shall be made by the Chief Driver under the control of the Chief Judge.

#### **Homologation**

The site installations must have been checked and certified by a qualified Homologator as complying with minimum Standing List Homologation. Spot checks may be arranged by the Tournament Committee or appointed Homologator before or during the competition.

#### **Calendar**

It is the responsibility of the Tournament organiser that the tournament bid is submitted to and approved by the Tournament Committee. Once approved, the Tournament Committee is responsible for publishing the tournament on the national calendar and E&A Calendar and IWWF - EMS.

### **4.2 INTERNATIONAL CALENDAR COMPETITIONS**

#### **Chief Judge / Appointed Officials**

The Tournament Committee will prepare a list of officials available to officiate as Chief Judge, Homologator, Calculator, Judge Panel, Chief Driver and Drivers. The Chief Judge shall be a Level 1 (J1) or Level 2 (J2) Judge depending on the level of Homologation, but to a minimum of Normal Homologation.

The Tournament Organiser will invite the selected officials and assist with transport and accommodation if required. It is the responsibility of the Tournament Organiser to ensure that there are enough officials to run the competition to the correct level of Homologation.

The Chief Judge shall supervise all judging and scoring operations and shall select the Judges and the assistants for each event from the available Appointed Judges

#### **Homologation**

The site installations for all events must have been checked to comply with the correct level of Homologation standard.

#### **Calendar**

It is the responsibility of the Tournament organiser that the tournament bid is submitted to and approved by the Tournament Committee. Once approved, the Tournament Committee is responsible for publishing the tournament on the national calendar or European Calendar via the EMS system on the IWWF website if appropriate.

### **4.3 FUN / OTHER COMPETITIONS**

#### **Appointed Officials**

The Tournament Organiser will invite the selected officials and assist with transport and accommodation if required. It is the responsibility of the Tournament Organiser to ensure that there are enough officials to run the competition to the desired Homologation rating.

#### **Homologation**

The site installations for all events must have been checked to comply with the correct level of Homologation standard.

#### **Calendar**

It is the responsibility of the Tournament organiser that the tournament bid is submitted to and approved by the Tournament Committee. Once approved, the Tournament Committee is responsible for publishing the tournament on the national calendar.

## **SECTION 5 – GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **5.1 SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT WATERSKI ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP**

All skiers wishing to enter any South African Tournament Division Competition must be member of the South African Water Ski and Wakeboard Federation.

All officials and skiers must be registered on the IWWF EMS website. Afcon have an agreement with EUcon that we can participate in their events still until we have a significant number of participants.

#### **5.1.1 EXEMPTIONS**

None

#### **5.1.2 NEW MEMBERSHIP**

Membership application forms are available on request from South African Water Ski and Wakeboard Federation Headquarters or can be downloaded from the South African Water Ski Federation and Wakeboard webpage (<https://www.sawaterski.co.za/index.html>)

The cost of memberships is contained in the application form.

#### **5.3.3 FOREIGN SKIERS**

Foreign skiers not in possession of a SA skier's membership will be allowed to enter a South African Water Ski tournament provided they can produce a copy of their current skier licence they hold affiliated to EA or IWWF. A copy of the valid licence must be included with the skier's entry and submitted to the Tournament Division Secretary for the record.

## **5.2 RANKING LIST**

### **5.2.1 SA RANKING LIST**

The SA Ranking List will be extracted from the world list published annually by the IWWF and published on its website at <http://www.iwsftournament.com/>, and at the end of each season be revised to include results from any level of RSA competitions, by the Technical Committee, before publishing on the South African Waterski Website.

## **SECTION 6 – OFFICIALS QUALIFICATIONS**

These rules are an addition to those published by the IWWF - Confederation (E&A).

### **ALL SOUTH AFRICAN OFFICIALS MUST BE CURRENT MEMBERS OF SOUTH AFRICAN WATER SKI FEDERATION**

However, the Tournament Committee may approve the use of a qualified official that is a member of a federation that is a member of E&A and or IWWF.

**ALL QUALIFICATIONS ARE VALID FOR ONE YEAR ONLY AND SUBJECT TO RENEWAL.**

- 2) Officials Seminar: Any International Official who wishes to officiate at any titled event or Cash Prize 1 competition in any year must have attended one seminar within the previous 3 years - All International Officials are strongly encouraged to take part in the Officials Seminar as often as possible (at least once every 3 years) to increase their knowledge (or at least have officiate once in the current season) - National Officials are welcome to attend.
